## **PICKLEBALL RULES YOU SHOULD KNOW!**

### **RULES 11.L: Net Rules**



#### **Did You Know...**

**11.L3:** A player is allowed to go around the net post and cross the imaginary extension line of the net after hitting the ball, so long as the player or any item he or she is/was wearing or carrying does not touch the opponent's court. If the player goes around the net post and crosses the imaginary extension line of the net but does not make contact with the ball, a fault will be declared.

**11.L4:** If a player hits the ball over the net into the opponent's court, and then the ball bounces back over the net and bounces a second time without being touched by the opponent, the striking player wins the rally.
